





It suddenly occurred to me that it all started when my own kids were dancing (sort of) around the Maypole, getting tangled up / tripping over / getting muddy / getting stroppy while we all watched both proud but nervous, knowing that the 'men folk / school dads' were quite drunk when we erected said pole a couple of nights earlier: it was always a relief it didn't fall over and take out the Rode Hall Brass Band.



Our first / eldest has just bought his first house, the middle one does stuff we can't talk about (but we should all be glad she does) and the youngest knows more about politics (and why Russia is like what it is) than I do but – mercifully – ticks the same box as I do on polling day. In other words, it was a long time ago & they're now all adults...

Proud nanas have gone (x2) as has grandad and I'm sure we're not alone in seeing their ghostly shadows under the tree, keeping the pram in the shade.

Apparently, Dooley Wilson sang the first version of the song 'As Time Goes By' back in 1931 and every cat & their dog since, but the song just sprung to mind which is unusual as it's usually only Genesis that rattles around in my head & headphones...

The lyrics include the lines 'Never out of date, Hearts full of passion' which sort of sums up May Day perfectly, although the next line is 'Jealousy & hate' which it's perhaps best to conveniently ignore: I can remember one young chap trying to stab the Rector with his (thankfully plastic) sword but also smiling when another Rector's (3-legged) dog 'did his business' on the lawn, as if thinking 'this is <u>my</u> lawn, at <u>my</u> house and this is where I <u>always</u> do my afternoon dump!'

It's very possible some of the costumes worn today are actually the same ones my own kids wore (albeit washed at least once since) and I'm surprised there hasn't been a suggestion from an exceptionally noisy minority to ban them on the basis they humiliate & belittle via outdated stereotyping & glorifying past traditions that have no place in todays society that must reflect all views, even if the vast majority are happy to leave things as they are and remember times when things were rather more straightforward, more innocent and – frankly – nicer.

It seems to me that some people (usually not many, despite the fuss & outrage) want to change the country we live in....then complain when it doesn't work (of course, it's not their fault) and someone else complains about that and....it's not Elton John's circle of life, it's a circle of chaos & misery....why can't we embrace & appreciate what we've got & be grateful for the good things in life....be balanced & not obsessed with outrage and the feeling a day isn't complete without it?

I'm glad we still have MayDay and those costumes haven't changed. I'm pleased the Maypole (it's the same one!) is still there, even if the Head Teacher had to complete a 300-page H&S Risk Assessment about kids being strangled in the ribbons. I'm glad the songs haven't changed, even if Genesis have never played The Spiders Web....

And I'm glad we still have today – even with my parents missing.....






