## Specialist Sports' funding – end of year review July 2024

The government is continuing to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The government's aim in providing this funding is to ensure the health, enjoyment and wellbeing of the children. The money can only be spent on improving the quality of the schools PE and sports provision.

71% of Y6 children leaving Astbury in July 2024 achieved the following:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

Our school received £16,640.00 for the Year September 2023 – August 2024. (£16,000 + £10 x 64 pupils)

## What we will spend our funding on this school year 2024 – 2025.

We will continue to fund Amaven to further develop the PE curriculum and assessment throughout school and support staff in their delivery of PE. We will also buy into the Education and Community Partnership to give our children access to a range of tournaments and competitions locally. Continuing this year, part of our funding will be spent on employing a KICK coach to deliver a sports afterschool club and promote sport through mentoring.

For the 2024-25 academic year, we are expecting a funding total of £16, 660
