#### **A HUGE ASTBURY WELCOME**

Welcome to the new school year! We hope that everyone had a fantastic summer. A very warm welcome to all our new pupils and their families, we hope that they all settle quickly into school life and enjoy their time here at Astbury

Please remember that school opens at 8.45am, and ensure that your child is on time, so that lessons can commence promptly at 9am after registration.

All children, unless agreed otherwise, must enter school via the playground. Any children arriving to school after 9am, must come in through reception to ensure that they are signed in by a member of staff.

### YEAR 3 & 4 - STANDON BOWERS

Last Wednesday saw members of Class Mary embarking on their visit to Standon Bowers, an outdoor activity centre in Staffordshire. They were to spend two nights away from home, some children for the first time, having lots of fun while learning about themselves and developing many new skills.

Standon Bowers lies only 19 miles from Astbury, but its secluded, safe and rural location provided the perfect place for our children to experience a range of activities. Children slept in comfortable dormitories, having unpacked and then made their own beds. Each day was action-packed, with the emphasis on children pushing their own limits while building their self-confidence and teamwork.

The children tested themselves by caving, rock climbing, and negotiating a trail through the woods while unable to see. They learned how to build a shelter from natural materials, and stretched their self-confidence to the limit on a low ropes course which saw them moving over a number of obstacles without touching the ground. They worked together to solve physical problems, such as moving the team across the ground only using a few upturned milk crates.



Wednesday evening saw groups attempting to make a protective case to save a raw egg from a 4-metre drop to the ground, while Thursday evening was spent around a campfire toasting marshmallows to make s'mores. Children also had free time in a games room or out in the grounds. Each day was punctuated by meals and snacktimes- it's amazing how much they will eat after being on the go throughout the day! As if all the activities weren't enough, children also undertook chores such as vacuuming and table clearing- all skills which I'm sure will be useful at home...

When our time at Standon Bowers came to an end, children all stripped their own beds and repacked their bags. Repacking gave rise to our 'quote of the trip' from one pupil who shall remain nameless: "So that's where Mum packed my pants!" As we always say, learning can happen anywhere, any time...

Finally, the party returned to Astbury on Friday afternoon, tired but very, very happy. Our children surpassed themselves in their good behaviour, resilience, courage, cheerfulness and determination. They showed teamwork, care for each other and a love of life, and we are very proud of them.

Many thanks to parents for supporting their children in undertaking the trip, and thanks also to Mrs. Wade, Mrs. Bonney, Mrs. Kerins, Mrs. Lalkham, Miss Hughes and Mr. Davies who supported the children at various times during the visit.

#### **CULTURAL DIVERSITY DAY AT CONGLETON HIGH SCHOOL**

In the South African workshop they learnt about African beading and made a fish. African drumming was great fun but LOUD! #### **ATTENDANCE**

Please ensure you only take your child on holiday during the school holidays. Any absence for a holiday during term time will be unauthorised unless it is for an exceptional circumstance. Please note that 10 unauthorised sessions will lead to a fine.

The Penalty Notice fine would be: £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days £160 per parent, per child if paid between 21-28 days. If the fine is not paid within 28 days, you may be prosecuted under \$444.1 of the Education Act 1996. School holiday dates are available on the website..


