

Specialist Sports' funding – end of year review August 2017

The government is continuing to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum until 2020 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The government's aim in providing this funding is to ensure the health, enjoyment and wellbeing of the children. The money can only be spent on improving the quality of the schools PE and sports provision.

What has the funding paid for?	Amount	Effect

Our school received £8510 for the Year September 2016 – August 2017.

What we will spend our funding on this school year 2017 – 2018.

We will continue to fund our sports' teacher to further develop the PE curriculum and assessment throughout school and support staff in their delivery of PE. We will also buy into the Congleton Education and Community Partnership to give our children access to a range of tournaments and competitions locally. The extra-curricular programme for KS1 has proved popular and this year will be extended to include the EYFS children too.

For the 17-18 academic year, we are expecting an increased funding total of £17,260.
