

Specialist Sports' funding – end of year review July 2018

The government is continuing to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum until 2020 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The government's aim in providing this funding is to ensure the health, enjoyment and wellbeing of the children. The money can only be spent on improving the quality of the schools PE and sports provision.

What has the funding paid for?	Amount	Effect
Daily mile track around the field	£15,660	This is still in the planning process – to date school has paid for planning review and is now in the process of writing a heritage statement and completing a full planning application. An order has been approved for the spending of the funds as these should have been spent by Aug 31 st 2018. The planned effect is that children's fitness is improved through increased access to running / walking.
Amaven sports assessments, challenge days, planning and daily movement sessions	£400	The funding has allowed children to engage in both skills sessions and competitive activities. Challenge days have shown individual, class and school progress in core PE skills during the year. Focused planning and assessment for each class - sustainability in the future
Congleton Education and Community Partnership	school sports £450	The children have had access to an increased range of competitions. Children displaying and improving their skills and sense of teamwork. There have been a number of children who have participated in sports' competitions such as cross country, for the first time
Extra-curricular programme of sports for the KS1 children.	£750	Younger children focussed on building new skills in sport

Our school received £17,260 for the Year September 2017 – August 2018.

What we will spend our funding on this school year 2018 – 2019.

We will continue to fund Amaven to further develop the PE curriculum and assessment throughout school and support staff in their delivery of PE. We will also buy into the Congleton Education and Community Partnership to give our children access to a range of tournaments and competitions locally. The extra-curricular programme for KS1 has proved popular and this year will be extended to include the EYFS children and Y3 children too.

Funding will also be used to enhance sports' provision in the EYFS/KS1 through a cycle / scooter track.

For the 2018-19 academic year, we are expecting a funding total of £16,930.
